



Surrey DLD CEN: Frequently Asked Questions

- **What does CEN stand for?**

Clinical Excellence Network (CEN) Meeting. These are meetings for professionals to share and discuss good practise in key areas such as assessment, intervention, research, outcome measures and communication.

- **What does DLD stand for?**

Developmental Language Disorder (DLD). This includes individuals who have disordered language skills that cannot be accounted for by generally slow development or a physical abnormality.

- **Where are CEN meetings held?**

- **How do I get to Moor House School?**

You can travel to Hurst Green Rail station then walk (5 minutes) down the road to the school. There is no parking on site. There is a car park at Holland Sports Club just past the school on the right hand side or outside on the road.

- **When are the CEN meetings?**

We hold two CEN meetings each year. Usually, one meeting is in November and one is in May. Meetings tend to run in the afternoons from 13:00 – 16:00. However, this may vary depending on the preference of CEN members and availability of speakers. Members will be informed of any date or time in advance.

- **How do I book a place or confirm my attendance?**

- **What topics are generally covered at CEN meetings?**

Meetings involve specialists in field of DLD presenting current information on methods to measure and/or support development of receptive language, expressive language, vocabulary, speech sound production, memory and social communication skills of children with DLD. We vary age group focus from preschool to post-16. There is always an opportunity to discuss and network during meetings.

- **How much does it cost to be a member of the CEN?**

It costs £15 for annual membership. This includes attendance at two meetings, sharing of handouts/resources from meetings and email contact between meetings. Fees can be paid to our CEN treasurer, Caroline Morearis, at a meeting.

- **Is it possible to attend just one CEN meeting?**

Yes, it costs £10 to attend a meeting as a non-member.
